2018 CHECKRIDE SCHOLARSHIP GUIDELINES

Purpose

This scholarship award provides \$500 in support of successful completion of a checkride for the private pilot certificate or more advanced level certificate/rating (e.g., instrument, commercial, etc.). The award is intended to support the aspirations of women to pursue aviation as a career or for personal achievements.

Scholarship Eligibility

1. U.S. citizen or permanent resident of the U.S.
2. resident of the State of Iowa; if not a resident of Iowa, the applicant must provide documentation that:
 - a) she is closely affiliated (student, faculty, staff) with a college/university in the State of Iowa, OR
 - b) that she resides in a contiguous state lacking a nearby 99s Chapter that is active.
3. membership in the 99s for at least one month prior to submission of the application
4. proficient in English
5. at least 16 years of age
6. solo endorsement or private pilot certificate; if appropriate, applicant must possess a current flight review
7. current FAA medical certificate for the certificate/rating pursued
8. passed written examination for the certificate/rating pursued

Scholar Responsibilities

1. successful completion of the checkride within 1 year of award
2. present application request at Iowa 99s meeting
3. meet with Iowa 99s Scholarship Chair or assigned Iowa 99s mentor to provide bimonthly progress reports signed by scholar and instructor with logbook copies
4. attend Iowa 99s meeting to provide brief progress report at 6 months and final report for successful completion of the checkride
5. submit documentation of successful completion of the checkride

Application Deadline – March 31

Scholarship Application

1. Completed Application form
2. Copy of your Solo Endorsement OR Private Pilot Certificate
3. Copy of current FAA medical
4. Copy of logbook pages for last 6 months
5. Two letters of recommendation – instructor and another referee active in aviation
6. Essay (750 words) – What is your goal in aviation? How will you continue in aviation following the successful completion of your checkride? How will you contribute to the mission of the 99s?

Scholar Selection Panel (3-member panel of judges from aviation community selected by Iowa 99s)

1. Iowa 99s Scholarship Chair (or designate from Iowa 99s) plus 2 individuals from among the following organizations:
 - a) Iowa Aviation Promotion Group member
 - b) Iowa Certified Flight Instructor
 - c) Iowa Aviation-Related Corporation
 - d) Iowa EAA Chapter member
 - e) Iowa FAAS Team member
 - f) NCS 99s member (not in the Iowa Chapter)
2. Selections will be based on completion of a scholarship ranking form that assigns numerical values for criteria required in application documents
3. If there are no qualified applicants, the selection panel reserves the right to withhold the scholarship.

Scholarship Timeline

1. Applications due by **March 31**
2. Applications submitted for panel review by **April 15**
3. Scholarship Award reviews submitted to the Iowa Chapter Chair by **May 15**
4. Scholarship recipient notified by **June 1**
5. Scholarship recipient submits bimonthly progress reports beginning **August 1**
6. Scholarship recipient submits documentation of successful checkride completion by **June 1, 2019**
